In the Name of God Amen, the eighteenth
day of February one thousand eight hundred and forty six
James Brumwell of Whalley in the parish of
Bathurst in the West Riding of the County of York
Gentleman being very sick and weak of body but of
perfect mind and memory do hereby make and declare this
my last Will and Testament that is to say First I direct my
funeral and埋葬 expenses to be paid by the will of
my just All and what it is by All and desire that my
true All should have and enjoy all my property of whatsoever
kind during the time of her natural life after which it is my
will that I shall be divided equally amongst my children
the living share and have all and in case any of them
shall die during the life of my true All it is then my will
that their children if any shall have the same share equally
amongst them and in the case of my deceased daughter Anne
the late wife of James Stewart Doctor of Physick Physician
it is my will that to her children shall come the sum
of £1000 and her further £1000 worth land to be
divided equally amongst them share and share all
but in case any of them should die the sum to be
sooner to divide shall descend to her a kitchen share
equally between them if more than one and in case they
should all die leaving no issue then this share to be

that they are the subscribers witnesses to the last will and
Testament of James Gurney late of Highgate aforesaid
Gentleman deceased bearing date the eighteenth day of
January last and they further made oath that as

the said eighteenth day of february the said Robt
duly executed his said Will by making his mark at
the foot and thereof in the presence of three witnesses
both of whom were present at the same time and
respectively in the presence of the said Robt —
wherein this witness bore as witness of the
same to the said Robt and by further mark and
