Chair's Message

I'm sorry to have to report that we lost our fight to save the last remaining building of High Mill at Bentham. Although the planning officer agreed with us that the building, although not listed, should be regarded as a heritage asset, the Craven District Council Planning Committee members went against the advice of the officer and voted unanimously for the building to be demolished.

We remain very concerned about Craven District Council's proposed planning application for three retail outlets with flats above to be built on the site of the Ashfield Car Park toilet block in Settle. This building would have a devastating impact on the Friends Meeting House and surroundings. Whilst realising that this is a busy time of year I urge you to send in an objection if you haven't already done so. There is still just time!

These matters highlight the uphill struggle we face to preserve our heritage and the importance of the work of the Trust in North Craven. It is for this reason that it is vital we continue to attract members to support the work we do and I would urge you to persuade friends and neighbours to take out a subscription and join us.

Accompanying this newsletter is our programme of events for 2023 which, following the difficulties we have had in the last couple of years due to Covid, we have at last been able to arrange well in advance.
